

The Alumni of I Can Fly Girls High School continue to amaze us. Their academic achievements have given us much to be proud of. Each program recipient receives tuition fees and a small stipend to attend colleges, universities, or a trade school of their choice. Each year more students are added to the program as they make their transition from secondary school to college. Providing scholarships to the Butterfly Girls is an investments of a lifetime.

OVERVIEW

\$232,512 EDUCATION

Educational programs and special services were provided for children and youth from seven counties in Kenya. Children ages O-18 years old who are affected by early marriage, female genital mutilation, child labor, sexual abuse, child pregnancy, HIV/AIDS, and low-income backgrounds participated in programs offered through I Can Fly High School, Pre School, Rescue Center and Alumni outreach programs. Secondary school students received tuition fees, housing, meals, uniforms, school supplies, Covid-19 supplies, communication services, mattresses, hygiene kits, books

and school supplies. The Scholars program recipients received tuition fees and stipends to attend various universities, colleges and trade schools. Educational compliances, legal fees, registrations, travel expenses, enrichment

activities, medical care, outreach services and special trainings were provided. The local community participated in a medical camp for health education. We also provided beds and supplies to youth in Tanzania.







DEVELOPMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE

Development and Infrastructure projects were provided at I Can Fly High School, Preschool and I Can Fly Rescue Center. We continued construction on the new administration building with landscaping, and roofing gutters for rain preservation. The construction of a rescue house for children and youth at the I Can Fly Rescue Center began Phases 1 and 2. We completed a borehole project which included solar energy connections. Construction of a new Pre-School which included two classrooms and an office for Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten levels was completed during Term Two. Water projects were performed at I Can Fly High School which included a new borehole equaling over 600 feet with casings and a new piping system. A new front face perimeter wall was constructed to enforce better security and privacy for students and staff. All school buildings and facilities received regular maintenance and upkeep.

\$27,938 TRANSPORTATION

Students received transportation fees for chartered buses and private vehicles. Emergency vehicles were rented during rescue efforts to ensure the safety of trauma victims and survivors. Fuel, repairs and regular maintenance were provided for all I Can Fly School vehicles. Each vehicle was insured for the school year.





\$45,989 FOOD PROGRAM


The Food Program provided I Can Fly School,
Pre- School and Rescue Center recipients
three meals per day throughout the year. We
also distributed nutritious meals to homeless
youth in Nairobi on a monthly basis. Clean
water and firewood were provided to prepare
hot meals one ach campus. Meals consisting
of vegetables, beans, maize, bread and fruits
were provided regularly.

\$82,251 OPERATING EXPENSES

Traveling expenses were provided for global travel, accommodation, meetings, internet services, communications, postage, printing, mailing services, office supplies, marketing, advertisement, contractor fees and outreach activities were provided throughout the year. Global entry compliances, insurance and trainings were conducted on a regular basis.


