\$143,336 EDUCATION

Educational programs, services and outreach projects included traditional instruction for children and youth at I Can Fly High School, I Can Fly Pre-School in addition to outreach activities such as period poverty campaigns, and female genital mutilation education. Students from ten counties in Kenya ages 4-18 years old who are affected by early marriage, female genital mutilation, abandonment and low - income backgrounds were

beneficiaries of the program.

Provisions were made for tuition fees, housing, meals, uniforms, school supplies, mattresses, hygiene kits, books, desks, school compliances, security, legal fees, enrichment activities, tutoring medical care,

and communications. I Can Fly High School Alumni received financial assistance for university, college, trade-school fees and living expenses through the I Can Fly Scholars Program.



DEVELOPMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE

Projects included the ongoing construction of the Big Butterfly House dormitory on the I Can Fly High School campus. Phase three commenced with wall plastering, floor tiling, painting and interior artwork. Roofing materials which included iron sheets and water-resistant ceilings were installed. Electrical connections

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation fees included fuel for four ICF school vehicles, insurances, toll fees, vehicle repairs and maintenance for the benefit of ICF High School programs and services. Taxis were provided for student emergencies during after-school hours. Transportation fees were provided for Scholar program recipients traveling to universities, colleges and trade schools nation-wide. All I Can Fly vehicles received regular maintenance, diagnostic testing, inspections and safety check-ups.

OPERATING EXPENSES

Overall operations included traveling expenses for local and global travel, accommodation, meetings, internet services, communications, staffing costs, postage, printing, mailing services, office supplies, marketing, advertisement, contractor fees and outreach activities. Compliances, insurance, bank fees, and trainings were provided for throughout the year.


FOOD PROGRAM

Food Programs at I Can Fly High School and Pre-School provided three meals per day to children and youth ages 4-18 years old. Clean water, firewood, cooking gas and kitchen supplies were provided to prepare hot meals for all children on two campuses including special outings and guest relations.

Students were also provided special lunches during off-campus activities. Balanced meals consisting of vegetables, beans, maize, bread, meat and fruits were provided.


